
WINEMAKER NOTES

Petit Verdot (peh-tee vur-doe) originates in southwestern France. It is mostly used as a blending grape in Bordeaux-style reds. However, it is gaining in popularity as a single varietal. It does well in hot, dry climates making it a perfect grape for Texas.

Winemakers love it for its intense color and structured tannins, making it ideal for blending. As a single varietal it tends to be inky dark and fragrant with well-balanced tannin and acid.

TASTING NOTES

Almost plum in color, this Petit Verdot starts off with aromas of violet, spice, mulberry, and a touch of vanilla. It is bursting with earthy flavors of sage, cocoa, and espresso, with a hint of red fruit on the finish. Structured tannins bring out the flavors of black tea leaves balanced with a touch of cranberry.
