WINEMAKER NOTES

Shiraz, perhaps better known as Syrah, is the 7th most planted variety in the world. The two different names often refer to the style in which it is made. Syrah tends to be made in a more old-world style, earthy and savory. Shiraz, on the other hand, is more new-world, fruit forward and even jammy. The primary component of the 2020 Shiraz was cultivated and made here on the property of Lost Oak Winery. Some of the vines are over 15 years old. This means lower yield but much more distinguished characteristics.

TASTING NOTES

The 2020 Shiraz has a rich garnet hue and lingering legs. The bouquet is concentrated with heavy aromas of mulberry, cinnamon, and hints of lavender. Spicy flavors of anise and cardamon flow beneath a current of blueberry and Bing cherry. Velvety tannins linger on the pallet with a hint of tea leaf.
